Review/Approval of Meeting Minutes & Financial Reports

President Sonnett asked for consent to the Agenda and the review of the minutes from the November 17th, 2009 Regular Town Meeting and the November 17th, 2009 Work Session. Commissioner Hourclé motioned to approve both sets of minutes, Commissioner Leonnig seconded. All minutes were approved unanimously.

Staff Reports

Town Clerk: Mr. Williams reported that revenue from parking fines in November totaled \$6,365.

Commissioner Reports

Commissioner Hourclé: Reported that he attended the "Envision Prince George's" meeting on November 19th at the Showplace Arena. Also, met with a representative from the University of Maryland (agriculture extension) who is consulting with area property owners to locate and organize a site for a farmer's market.

Commissioner Leonnig: Had no report at this time.

President Sonnett: President Sonnett reviewed highlights of the Treasurer's Report, as of November 30th, 2009. Commissioner Hourclé motioned to approve the Treasurer's Report, Commissioner Leonnig seconded. The Treasurer's Report was unanimously approved.

President Sonnett also reported on the following topics:

- Both Public Works Superintendent Lewis Carroll and Police Officer Andrew Ferraro are on medical leave and due back to work in January.
- The historic preservation division of the P.G. Planning Department is conducting an inventory of historical sites and resources in town. There will also be a general meeting to review the County's preliminary Historic Sites and Districts Plan next Thursday.
- The new Town website is up and enables staff to more easily post timely information for town residents and businesses.
- Received County Surplus Property listings. Stone building not on list but may be by May, 2010.
- Need to evaluate the meters on Old Mill Road. May have to purchase 3 new meters.
- Flagpole light will be replaced on Thursday and relocated closer to flagpole for safety reasons.
- County police will be switching radios over to a new frequency. Current estimate is \$45K.
- Have left messages with i-net and have yet to receive a response.

Commissioner Reports *(continued)*

President Sonnett delivered the Police Report for November, 2009

120 Town Citations were written in the month of November; State citations totaled 49. Activity: (Within town limits) 1 Auto Theft, 1 Recovered Auto, 2 Theft, 7 Vehicle Impounds, 1 Arrest (UUV), 11 Warrant Service, 3 Property Damage, 1 Missing Person—*all afore mentioned activity occurred in the downtown area and not within the residential area of town.* (Outside town limits): 3 Theft, 4 Stolen Auto, 1 Recovered Auto, 2 Theft from Auto, 1 Assault.
