


## Town Flag & Slogan



# ON THE AGENDA

## Draft Agenda for the Next Town Meeting

We are continuing to work on upgrading our Church Street Parking Lot to include future long-term daytime parking, as part of the Town's efforts with revenue enhancement. One of the items on the agenda for discussion and action will be for procurement of a Parking Kiosk for the lot. In our continuing efforts to clean up the Downtown area, we will also be voting on funding two additional waste receptacles to be installed in the Church Street Lot, and near the Bus Stop across from the 7/11. Also, an update on the Elm Street Repaving & Sidewalk Project will be offered, plus, Resolution 2016-05: Setting Town Services Fees, and, Resolution 2016-06: Adopting Parking Meter Rates are up for introduction and passage.

Further on the schedule, will be a discussion on an upcoming opportunity the Town has for television exposure through Channel 5 News. The Town will be featured in a 4-hour live broadcast on Fox 5's "Zip Trips" morning show series on 29 July 2016. They will be broadcasting on-site and are asking us to highlight several "Fine Dining Areas", and other "Areas of Interest" in our community, such as: Darnall's Chance House Museum, the Dutch Village Farmers Market, and Dr. William and Sarah Beanes Gravesite, to name but a few. It's a great opportunity to get some excellent exposure for the Town, and is something that we can use to market the Town's Sustainable Community status.

In addition, there will be some discussion on a request from the Marlborough Towne HOA for a Town Ordinance prohibiting parking on one side of Marlborough Drive. This will require subsequent curb painting and additional signage as well. The Town Flag & Slogan campaign continues. All residents have the opportunity to review the designs and go online with "Survey Monkey" to put in their vote for their favorite choice. We will be counting the votes in the future to determine the winning selection for our Town Flag.

The Fiscal Year 2017 Town Operating Budget will be introduced, and adoption for the FY17 Budget is scheduled for the 7 June 2016 Town Meeting. This earlier than normal date is required in order to have it go into effect at the beginning of the fiscal year on 1 July.

Finally, there will be discussion on the proposed PGC Zoning Rewrite and how it effects our downtown district. The Town is hoping for a subsequent meeting with Chad Williams, M-NCPPC coordinator for the PGC Zoning Rewrite. We previously met with Mr. Williams at the Town Hall on 23 February 2016.


